___ **Reconciliation in Labour** - This is for allies, including non-Indigenous activists, to learn the history of Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island (North America). Facilitated by Indigenous labour activists, its purpose is to build meaningful, long-term relationships among Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples inside and outside of our workplaces, with the aim of acknowledging labour's commitment to Truth and Reconciliation. This course supports the decolonization of Indigenous peoples and the increase of Indigenous peoples' representation in our workplaces and in our unions. Participants do not need any previous experience and are encouraged to bring open minds and hearts.

___ **Domestic Violence in the Workplace** - Helps participants gain a deeper understanding of the dynamics of domestic violence at work, and the role of the union and the employer in addressing it. Participants learn ways to best support members who may be experiencing domestic violence, including how to recognize and respond to the warning signs and risk factors, and how to connect Members to support and services in the community.

___ **Organizing for Change** - Curious about the role you can play in shaping decisions that impact your workplace, your community, and the future you envision together? Discover how to align your time, skills, and goals with others in your community. Explore existing opportunities-and learn how to create new ones-to turn shared efforts into meaningful results.
